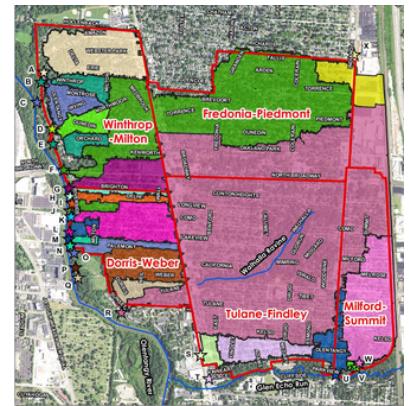
Blueprint Design Update January 2024

Walhalla Stream Restoration is a Win-Win

Stream restoration in the Walhalla Ravine helps preserve one of the city's natural resources and helps improve water quality by removing TSS that is entering the stream due to bank erosion. By doing this stream restoration, the Blueprint project saves over \$25 million and requires less green infrastructure to be built throughout the Clintonville 3 Blueprint project area.

Walhalla Design Update

Currently: The design team is working to produce 90% plans, incorporating feedback from our last public meeting on October 11, 2023. The City's real estate team has also begun working with the 7 impacted properties regarding easements.



DPU Response to Resident Concerns

TREES	Currently, there are 11 trees slated for removal: ten 18" dbh trees and one 48" dbh tree as well as other small vegetation
CLOSING WALHALLA RD	Encouraged to take this ask to commission, not on the table at this time
GUARDRAIL	Guardrail is necessary to uphold city standards for pedestrian and vehicle safety
COMPREHENSIVE APPROACH	The ravine was studied and this is the section in most need of bank stabilization and stream restoration; aligns with Blueprint project goals
